

A Thought from the Chaplain


The Father Who Speaks

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. John 1:1

Throughout the Old Testament, the Father had frequently spoken to His people through the prophets. These prophets were people who lived close to His heart and who heard His voice. The last words of the Old Testament, were spoken by such a man. Malachi foresaw a time when there would be a miraculous reconciliation between fathers and their estranged children, a promise that applies to all human beings, separated as we are by sin from our Father in Heaven. The one who brings an end to the alienation between us and our Father is Jesus. Here, at the very start of his Gospel, John describes Jesus as "The Word." Whatever else this means, it means that we have a Father in Heaven who speaks. He is not a silent dad, emotionally or physically remote. No, He has consistently spoken through His prophets and now speaks with finality and fullness through His one and only Son. This Son, unlike the prophets, was alive before time began. This Son was present to the Father before the creation of the world. Aren't you grateful that we have a Father who speaks to us?

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6)

Pray with me. Father, we come to You in Jesus' name. Thanking You that You spoke to us through the prophets, but now, supremely and completely through Your Son Jesus. Help us to realize that He is our only hope in coming back to You. Amen.
